Personal Planning

- We assist people to make a plan to do what they want to do in the community.

Community Support

DDRC can assist people to:

- Volunteer
- Find recreational activities

Community Living Network (CLN)

This program assists adults with developmental disabilities to find a home to live in by themselves or with a roommate.

Community Respite Network (CRN), Bow Place Respite and In - Home Support Services.

We assist people when they need to take a break from each other.
